Budget Adjustment Request

- Available to potentially increase COA based on certain allowable expenses
- Examples: Medical and Childcare out of pocket expenses
- A one-time computer purchase
- REMINDER: Step Exam fees are not eligible (Already included in COA)

- Credit card debt
- Moving/relocation costs
- Vehicle purchase/payments
- Board exam review courses/study materials
- Costs related to away rotations
- Costs related to applying for Residency programs (ERAS and NRMP Fees)
- Private student loan payments



Misnomers

- I should borrow extra for emergencies
- I can borrow as much as I want now and worry about it later
- If I need more money, I can apply for a private student loan
- I can use my student loan to buy a car
- I am building credit by borrowing student loans
- Student loans will not prevent me from buying a home in the future

- Summer 2025 Tuition Due Date: June 28, 2025


